# **Stroke in Singapore 2021**

#### What is a stroke?

A stroke occurs when there is a disruption of blood flow to the brain, depriving the area of blood & damaging it.

There are two main types of stroke: ischaemic (IS) & haemorrhagic (HS). HS is generally more severe, presenting greater impairment in patients. Although the incidence of stroke has risen over time, mortality from stroke has declined.

## **Haemorrhagic Stroke (HS)**

HS occurs when a blood vessel ruptures & causes bleeding in the brain

# Ischaemic Stroke (IS)

IS occurs when a brain blood vessel is blocked by fatty plaque formation or a dislodged blood clot

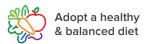

## Common risk factors among stroke patients

The two most common risk factors for both HS & IS were high blood cholesterol & high blood pressure

81%	High blood pressure	81%
61%	High blood cholesterol	88%
30%	Diabetes	46%
27%	Smoking	36%
13%	Atrial fibrillation or flutter (Irregular & unusually fast heart rhythm)	21%
